

OVERCOMING EMOTIONAL MANIPULATION

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This particular deprogramming guide illustrates how vicious narcissists take things out of context in order to manipulate people of good faith. It is provided in conversational format.

Vicious Narcissist: I murdered 5 people and raped them before and after, forgive me and absolve me.

Reasonable Person: You have criminally harmed people and proven your own propensity for such vicious misconduct by your own actions which act as evidence. So, based on all available evidence, the preponderance suggests there is only a 17% chance that you won't do it again. In weighing the likelihood of your re-offending given the nature of your crimes and for the sake of justice for the victims and safety of society given available data, I'm more comfortable if you pay for your crimes in some way even if you don't get anything out of it because the victims and society will get something out of it.

Emotional/Co-Dependent Person: If you give your word that you truly repent and will never offend again in such a manner, I forgive you and believe you should be absolved as a result of your saying the magic words "I repent and forgive me".

Vicious Narcissist: The reasonable person is a hypocrite. Hey, reasonable person, are you saying you are perfect? Do you expect others to forgive your trespasses and sins? Well? Why don't you forgive and absolve me then? Co-Dependent did. Co-Dependent is the more Christian.

Reasonable Person: I never stated I was perfect. I do not expect to get away with crimes. I'm smart enough to know that rules exist and laws exist. Have you ever played a game or even watched any sports at all? Have you seen Hockey? What happens to a player who fouls in Hockey? You understand a foul is when someone violates a rule of the game of Hockey, right? Or do I need to explain that to you as well. When someone violates a rule in Hockey they get sent to the penalty box. So, similarly, when someone violates the law often they get sent to the penalty box or maybe even lose money. Ever played Monopoly? Are all players at risk of going to jail if they land in the square that sends them or get the card that says so? Yes. Emotional/Co-Dependent Person: Jesus didn't hate. Jesus loves everyone, especially murderers. Jesus forgives vicious and doesn't judge. Reasonable person is mean and hateful. Vicious person, I believe you and if you say you repent I forgive you and know Jesus does too. Don't listen to Reasonable person. They are bordering on blasphemy with their claims.

Vicious Narcissist: I am just disregarding Reasonable Person. I agree with Co-Dependent. They know I'm a sinner just like they are and that Jesus saves and forgives. Reasonable Person is faithless. Shun Reasonable Person until they repent and accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior too.

Reasonable Person: If truly embracing Christianity, surely you know Christ's story and that as a result of vigilantism and questioning authority he was crucified by the government of his time just like the murderer and the thief. If Jesus had to pay for his crimes, why don't you? Are you suggesting you are more virtuous than Jesus and therefore more justified than he was when convicted and crucified? It's my understanding Jesus killed CHOMOS. How old were your victims? It seems to me the laws have evolved to penalize child rapists and murderers since that time. So, Jesus' vigilantism was remembered and lawmakers decided to avoid more vigilantism, it may be best to send a clear message that raping children is unacceptable and comes with a serious penalty to honor Jesus' legacy in holding people accountable including what he identified as corrupt public officials.
