So, once you have a degree or certification (which can take 1-2 years) then you can professionally get paid to work on cars or earn a living as a mechanic (qualified). But, buying a car, knowing how to drive a car, knowing how to repair a car, and being a mechanic are all related but different with different skill levels and knowledge. It's not as easy as say playing "Grand Theft Auto" where it is all a pre-programmed set of programmed events as a game where there are a limited number of possible outcomes (though it could be thousands or more because tech is that cool). There are many variables and people who know more about anything and everything than others on most any or all topics depending on the individual considered, their education, knowledge, and experience. While many religious organizations set up their own accreditation bodies, those are not recognized by nonsectarian education providers or those who are looking for a valid degree, diploma, or certification for something unrelated to religion. So, if a school is not accredited by the state and chooses to be religious or is church-based, those credits are often not transferable or only accepted at other non-accredited (where accreditation is not recognized by the US Department of Education nor any state office nor any nonsectarian or public educational services provider or simply doesn't exist even as an argument within the sectarian (segregated) communities that recognize their own accreditation (self-referential)) and/or "fraudulent" service providers of any sort. The purpose of church, in my opinion, is to set a foundation in practicing and promoting truth and virtue through good works and good deeds and recognize the equality of all from least to greatest as being all equal in the eyes of God (whom churches are supposed to put above everyone equally regardless of storefront or cultural influences while recognizing all humans, including those reinforcing God's essence in humanity which are the seeds of Truth and Virtue, as equal with equal right to share wisdom, knowledge, and perspective) in the spirit of brotherhood/sisterhood/etc where all siblings are equal and we are all children of God.
