

## A Sermon on Modernizing Mythology

Sermon by Rev. Minister Angela Smith of COPE for July 11th, 2021 (and beyond)

This sermon is in dialogue format and open to interpretation. It started as a strange linguistic equation on a piece of notebook paper. Below is what came of it.

Moon: Some people call me Cancer. Some say witches or aliens or ancient civilizations live on my surface. People only notice me when the sun does, and when I block out the sun. Sometimes they are so dehydrated they think an eclipse lasts forever or like 3 days. Could be something they ate or ergot poisoning, I'm not a doctor.

Taurus is farming and Libra is Justice. Very funny. I can be cardinal and fixed. I'm associated with the elements of air and earth.

Mercury: Not yet, be patient.

Earth: I am just a volatile canvas. Please continue.

Moon: People started believing in the power of heavenly bodies after noticing my influence on bodies of water. Just saying. I'm cardinal. I'm associated with the element of water.

Sun: No one would've even known you existed without my shining a light on you. They'd think an eclipse was punishment of some sort. Read much? I'm fixed. I'm associated with the element of fire. Did you really need that added?

Saturn: Some people call me Aquarius though that one was later attributed to Uranus after Uranus was discovered. I still claim Aquarius. I like the old ways. Some people call me Capricorn. People associate me with partying and depression. Ever been to a Saturnalia? Did you wake up with a hangover or other issue you found depressing? Maybe just that the party was over? Yeah, that's what I'm associated with for the most part. Oh, and some idiots think because Aquarius is the water-bearer that Aquarius is carrying water for everyone else and therefore a slave and being punished for something given the association with Uranus. "They have been shown to be most effective for conditions like pain management, stress-related insomnia, and cancer treatment side effects like fatigue and nausea." Religious Person: Are you praying for the sake of love or money or more as a wish for yourself? Is it like you are wishing for love and/or money? Or, is it like you are thinking of love and money as abstract intangibles that you are sending comforting support to in some way?

Superstitious Person: Wishing for myself.

Religious Person: Pardon the expression, my grandfather used to say these words of wisdom, "Shit in one hand, wish in the other, and see which fills up first."

Earth: Is that a fertilizer joke? Human poop is similar to dog or cat poop, it can't be used as fertilizer unless treated first. It can on things you don't plan to eat and just want to look at like flowers.

Superstitious Person: I don't want to marry a prison warden, prisoner, nor farmer. Stop trying to put that in my head. I just want love and money because I'm worth it.

Religious Person: The Free Market decides what is worth it objectively. So, a popular product that is demanded more than produced often gets more money than a product that is more produced than demanded. Subjectively, some people have paid over \$600,000 for an original work by someone who died in poverty. That explains money. Love is a gift you may have, may give away, and may recognize upon receipt.

Superstitious Person: I like gifts.

Superstitious Person: Why on earth would I want to leave that situation?

Religious Person: For love or money. An estimated 155,100,000 Americans filed federal income tax returns in 2020 for fiscal year 2019. Assuming they are in school and not gainfully employed, that leaves 254,100,000 adults or people of age of majority. Source: <https://www.childstats.gov/americaschildren/tables/pop1.asp> 61,000,000 Americans are disabled. Source: <https://www.cdc.gov/ncbddd/disabilityandhealth/infographic-disability-impacts-all.html#:~:text=61%20million%20adults%20in%20the,have%20some%20type%20of%20disability>. 52,000,000 Americans are over age 65 or were in 2018. Source: <https://www.prb.org/resources/fact-sheet-aging-in-the-united-states/> 2 in 5 Americans over age 65 are disabled. So, 20,800,000 elderly make up part of the 61,000,000 disabled. 3,000,000 minors make up part of that 61,000,000 as well. So, subtracting 23,800,000 from 61,000,000 we get 37,200,000. So, adding that reduced disabled number, since the children and elderly are included in the overall number for their age demographics, to the number of children under 18 and elderly, we get 163,300,000 people one may reasonably expect not to be in the work force even though that may vary. So, then we subtract the 163,300,000 from the total population in the US of 328,200,000 and get 164,900,000 people one would expect to be working. 8% of the population is made up of convicted felons. Source: <https://news.uga.edu/total-us-population-with-felony-convictions/> That amounts to 26,256,000 that may find finding gainful employment difficult as a result of their record and/or reputation. But, it would appear by income tax filings that 9,800,000 able-bodied and of age of majority Americans are unemployed. This would appear to be a 3.04% unemployment rate. But, that's a rough estimate. If you just eliminate minors from consideration, you might expect 254,100,000

to be working or self-sustaining adults. In such a case, 99,000,000 adults including elderly and disabled are unemployed or not filing income tax returns. And, that would make the rate of unemployed adults regardless of age or infirmity amount to 30.16% of the population. So, if we go with that number, you have about a 58% chance of marrying someone who is unemployed or who works in agriculture or being unemployed or working in agriculture. You have what appears to be a 42% chance of something else. In 1991, 44% of the global human population worked in agriculture. So, at that time you'd reduce the 42% chance of something else to 26%.
